

MEXICO: TEMPORARY RESIDENT WITH NO REMUNERATED ACTIVITIES PROCESS MAP

STEP 7: BIOMETRICS & INTERVIEW

After the temporary residence card is approved, the assignee will be required to attend an in person appointment at the INM office for biometrics and an interview. The temporary residence can be collected once it is issued.

STEP 6: REGISTRATION

Within 30 days after entering Mexico, the assignee must register themselves as a Non-Immigrant Visitor in the National Registry of Foreigners at a local INM office to be issued their temporary residence cards. Estimated Turnaround: 2 – 3 weeks

STEP 5: MULTIPLE IMMIGRATION FORM

At the port of entry, he/she will receive a Multiple Immigration Form (FMM) that will be used for post arrival formalities. The assignee may begin work at this point.

STEP 4: ENTRY TO MEXICO

The assignee may collect the visa once it has been approved and travel to Mexico.



STEP 1: INITIATION

Client initiates the case with FGI. FGI assesses work permit category and sends document checklist to the client. Client sends the documents listed on the checklist to FGI. Estimated Turnaround: 1- 3 days

STEP 2: DETERMINATION

Once all documentation is received for filing, FGI will review and provide feedback and/or verification. Estimated Turnaround: 1 – 3 days

STEP 3: APPLICATION FOR ENTRY VISA

The assignee should then apply for an entry visa at the Mexican consulate in their country of residence and pay the applicable visa fee. Personal appearance is typically required at the appointment. Estimated Turnaround: 2 - 7 days
